Carroll University Awards

CCE Student Award: The Cross-Cultural Experiences (CCE) Student Award was established to support students participating in approved CCEs. Awards vary based on the cost of the CCE and the financial need and merit of the applicant. Maximum award is 50% of program cost, up to \$5,000.00. Deadlines: Summer Programs: April 1st / Fall and Academic Year Programs: July 15th / Winter and Spring Programs: November 15th. <http://cce.carrollu.edu/?go=cceaward>.

Student Senate Cross-Cultural Experience Scholarship: Administered by Student Senate, this \$500 scholarship is available to any student participating in a CCE.

Llewelyn and Mary Williams Fund: A grant of \$1,000 for study in Wales for a minimum of one academic term.

Cross-Cultural Experience (CCE)

Carroll Courses

- local, domestic, and international options
- courses that allow students to use their own immersion (must be approved prior to registering for the course)
- pre-departure component, including academic and logistical preparation
- costs vary, but typically include transport, accommodations, required excursions, and some food
- available to students of all majors

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Study Abroad & Study Away

- summer, semester, and academic year options available
- study, internship, and volunteer experiences for credit available
- work with advisor to determine which courses are best taken abroad/away; may be major/minor credits, elective credits, or general education credits
- fees and amount of financial aid available depends on program chosen, see options below
- available to students of all majors

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Faculty-Led Courses

NCEP (New Cultural Experiences Program)

- 4-credit course
- 1-5 week travel portion, varies by course

CCS300 (Cross-Cultural Studies)

- 2-credit course
- 1-5 week travel portion, varies by course

Academic Departmental Offerings

- 2-4 credit course
- travel portion varies

Faculty-Supported Courses

- student identifies and/or designs and receives approval for immersion experience
- independent or group travel
- must include a minimum of 60 hours of immersion
- student works with faculty member independently or with other students to prepare for and reflect on immersion experience

NOTE: Advising with CCE Coordinator is required for immersion approval

Exchange Programs

- receive 100% of financial aid package
- pay Carroll University tuition
- room and board paid to the host institution
- Study Abroad Fees:
\$250/semester
\$150/summer

Affiliated Programs

- keep federal & state aid, but institutional aid does not apply
- pay cost of tuition at host institution to Carroll University
- room and board paid to the host institution
- Study Abroad Fees:
\$250/semester
\$150/summer

Unaffiliated Programs

- pay all tuition and fees directly to program, including room and board
- may be eligible to keep federal aid, but institutional aid does not apply

Study Abroad Fees:
\$500/semester
\$150/summer

NOTE: Advising with Assistant Director of International Education is required for program approval
